ost developers are utterly and deeply convinced of the efficiency of their creations - and it would probably be just a little strange if they were not. However, some developers such as Ultrasone's chief technical officer Florian König take their work that little bit more serious still and become advocacies of their own special missions. In this case, the mission in question: König's ambition to share with the wider world his enthusiasm about the new Ultrasone Edition 8 headphones.

This refers in particular to their patented S-Logic technology. Following extensive research, this technology was developed in response to König's conclusion that using measuremicrophone-derived ment smooth frequency responses to avoid the undesirable in-headlocalization associated with headphones is counterproductive and also requires taking into account the properties of the outer ear. However, the Ultrasone's have yet one other rather peculiar feature, and that is that of having their sound transducers fitted not over the centre of the ear - as in conventional headphones - but slightly off-centre and a little lower. This strategy is intended to provide Ultrasone users with a unique sound experience that is equal to sitting right in front of a set of speakers.

Another special feature of the Ultrasones' is their MuMe-

tal shielding which, according to König, reduces the Ultrasones' electromagnetic emissions to a tenth of that of unshielded headphones and thus makes them much less likely to cause tiredness and impact on human health in the way he believes unshielded headphones do. However, this is far from where Ultrasone's efforts to increase user safety stops, as the Ultrasone Edition 8s' are also fitted with 40 millimetre drivers. Together with a strong Neodym magnet, these highpurity copper coils drive the low resonance Mylar membrane, which - to increase its rigidity - has been covered with titanium.

The Ultrasone Edition 8 headphones – which are manufactured in Tutzing am Starnberger See, in Germany – feature the same sealed designs as their predecessor (Edition 9, 1/07). This makes them of particular appeal to everybody

who is not inclined to sharing his/her music with those around them and who in turn appreciate being shielded from any external noises.

In keeping with the Ultrasone Edition 8's overall specifications, it is also extremely comfortable, quite light and, thanks to its low impedance, perfectly suited for use with mobile devices that have low output voltages, such as Apple iPods, and a range of other devices. Our tests also showed that, although the Edition 8 does not quite match the deep bass sound of the Edition 9, which only impacted marginally on the power of "Saints" by Gravenhurst (The Western Lands", Warp/ RTD Warp 157), it's superior performance did make Nick Talbot's guitar and voice sound more clearly and forceful still.

This experience was repeated when using the Edition 8 with a Grado RA 1 (3/02)headphone amplifier, which again highlighted the contrast between the more powerful Edition 9 and the more subtle sounds picked up on by the Edition 8. The final Edition 8 test, using an open Sennheiser HD 800 (4/08), evened the scores, since the Edition 8 was not quite able to match the wide-ranging sound replication of the HD 800, but compensated with the immediacy of and clarity of its response. These features clearly make the Edition 8 a new benchmark for sealed headphones.
